2022 Court Dues

- 1. Court 398 pre-pays all Ladies' and Junior Daughters' National dues in February of each year. Ladies and Junior Daughters then have the option to pay their dues throughout the year.
- 2. Dues increased to \$300 in 2021. This new total includes \$91.20 for National dues and \$208.80 for local Court dues. The increase was approved by the Court membership at the December 2020 meeting.
- 3. It is recommended that dues be paid either annually, bi-annually, or quarterly, and that **final** *payments for the year be submitted by 30 Sep 2022*. Dues may be paid by check or PayPal. PayPal assesses a 2.9% fee in addition to the payment amount. If the fee is not included, the dues payment will be reduced by 2.9%.

Don't miss out on seeing life's precious moments. You know that every family wedding includes your Uncle Louis teaching the latest line dance. And every spring, Aunt Shirley pulls you into the kitchen to help bake a few cherry pies. Make sure you can stay in the mix by protecting your vision.

Keep an eye out for glaucoma.

The National Eye Institute (NEI) encourages you to save your sight from vision loss and blindness by knowing your risk for glaucoma—and doing something about it! Glaucoma is a group of diseases that damages the eye's optic nerve. It can lead to vision loss or blindness if left untreated. More than half of all people with glaucoma don't know they have it. And, quite often, by the time people are diagnosed with glaucoma, they have already begun to notice changes in their side, or peripheral, vision.

This is especially true for African Americans those over age 40 and those with a family history of glaucoma are at higher risk for the disease. More than 520,000 African Americans have glaucoma, and this number is expected to increase by more than 300,000 over the next 15 years. This disease is a leading cause of blindness among African Americans.

Don't just talk the talk.

Do something about glaucoma. Talking about it is the first step. The second step is to see your eye care professional and get a comprehensive dilated eye exam every 1 to 2 years if you are at higher risk. Don't wait until you notice vision problems to see your eye care professional.
